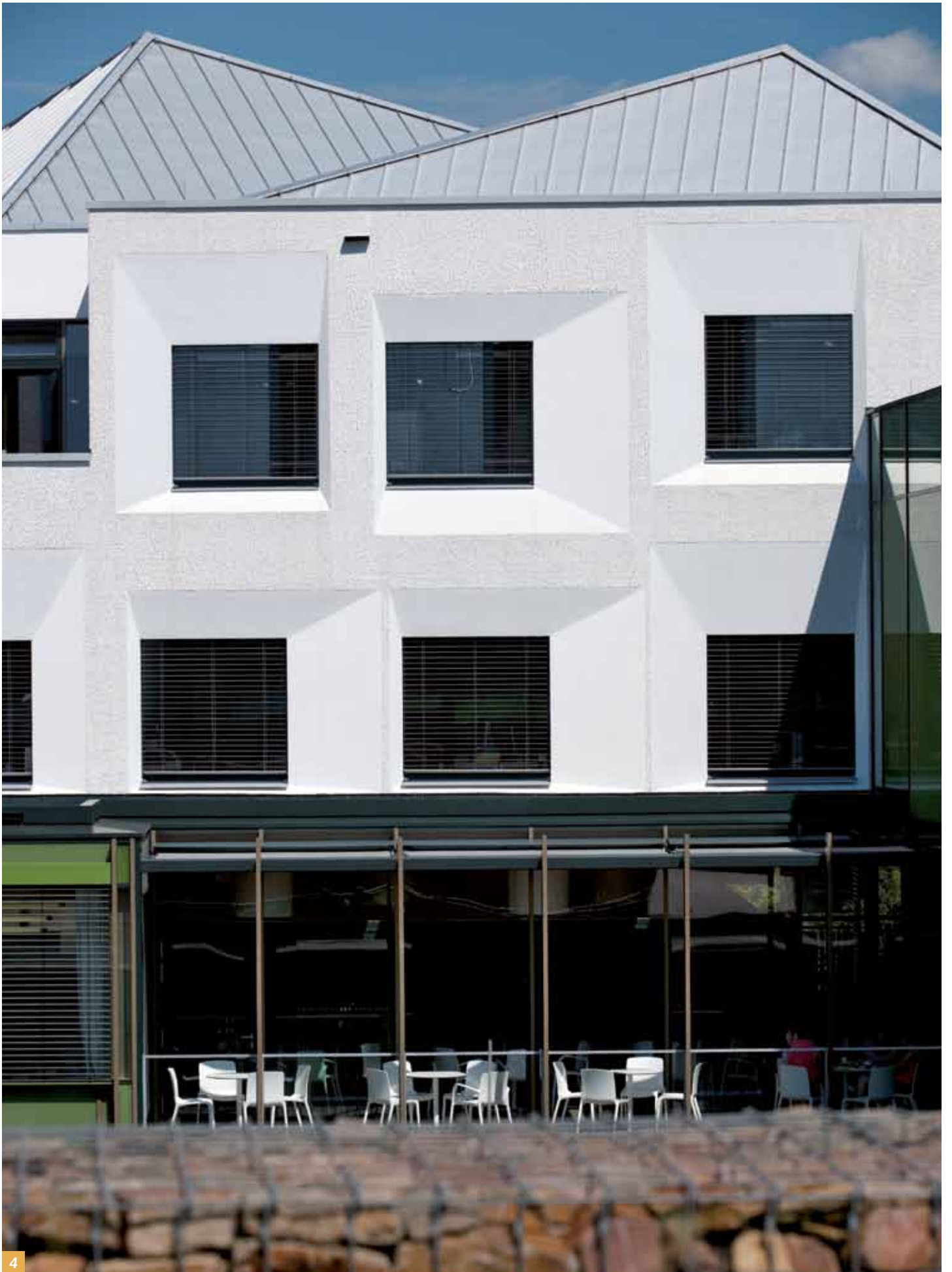

5 Allianz Arena, Munich (Germany)

Icon of the contemporary stadium construction: The Allianz Arena by the Pritzker Prize winners Jacques Herzog and Pierre de Meuron is one of the most modern soccer stadiums in Europe.

6 Kunsthaus KUB, Bregenz (Austria)

Architect Peter Zumthor's (awarded the Pritzker Prize) comment on his museum: "The House of Art stands in the light of Lake Constance. The body is constructed from steel, glass and cast concrete forming structure and room in the interior. From outside the building appears like illuminated. It absorbs the changing light of the sky and the lake, reflects light and colour and hints what might happen inside depending on the perspective, daytime and weather."

7 Linderhof Palace, Ettal (Germany)

Linderhof is the smallest of the three castles, which were conceived and ordered to be built by King Ludwig II. of Bavaria. The imposing decoration is a mixture of French and Bavarian Rococo.

First built in 1923 for Raoul La Roche, and later as of 1960, the home of the Fondation Le Corbusier that preserves, archives and documents Le Corbusier's oeuvre. The foundation could luckily also acquire the attached house of Albert Jeanneret to be able to preserve the unity of the building complex.

10 Evelyn Grace Academy, Brixton/ London (U.K.)

The school construction, Stirling Prize winner 2011, presents itself as open and identity-creating sculpture in a problematic district of London. The complex is divided in four learning buildings, so-called "schools-within-schools".

12 Federal Chancellery, Berlin (Germany)

The pavilion-like construction with the strongly tapered top is the landmark of the city of Turin. The construction started in 1863 as synagogue commissioned by the Jewish community. Due to the exploding costs the city took the project over and established the Museum of the Risorgimento (Italian, meaning The Resurgence).

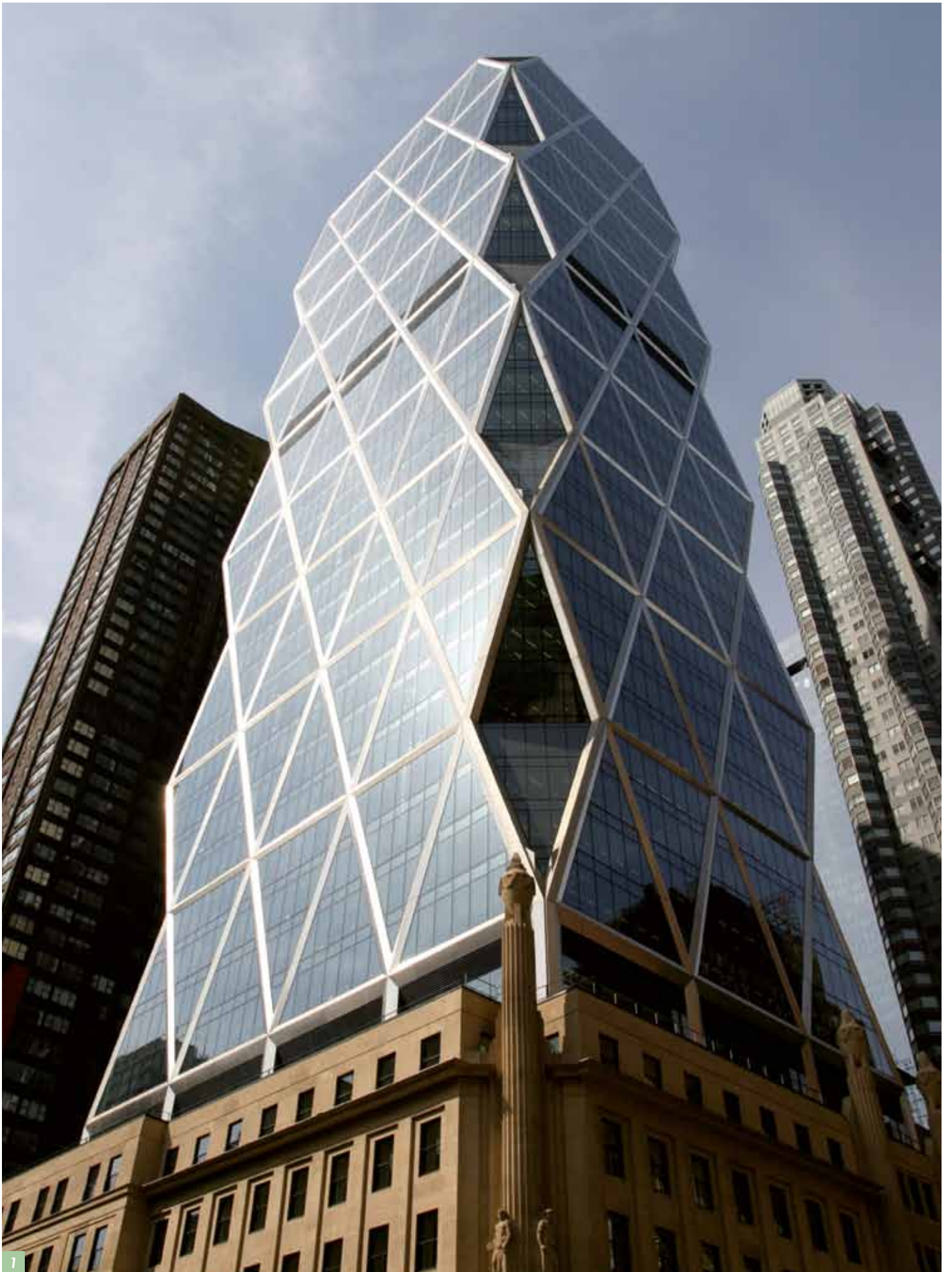

3 Grand Egyptian Museum, Conservation Centre, Giza (Egypt)

This construction will be an oeuvre of the superlatives. On the outskirts of Cairo, only 2 km away from the pyramids is the world's largest museum for Egyptian Antiquity being built. Next to exhibition areas, a library and media library it comprises 92,000 m² of covered floor space, plus, a congress center and a building for preservation and restoration. The museum with the translucent stone facade directs at the end of a magnificent view axis to the main attraction, the pyramids. The opening is planned for 2015.

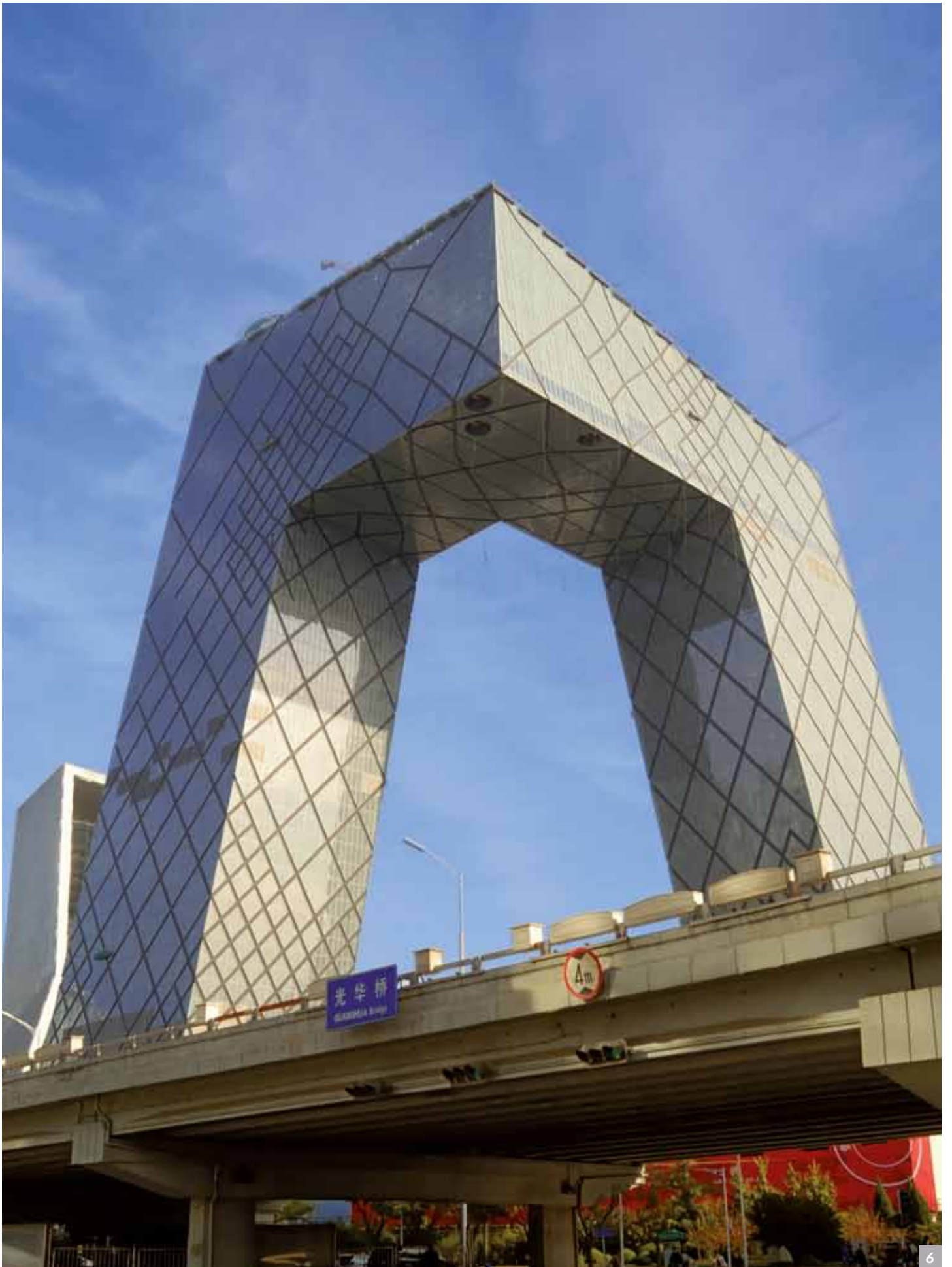

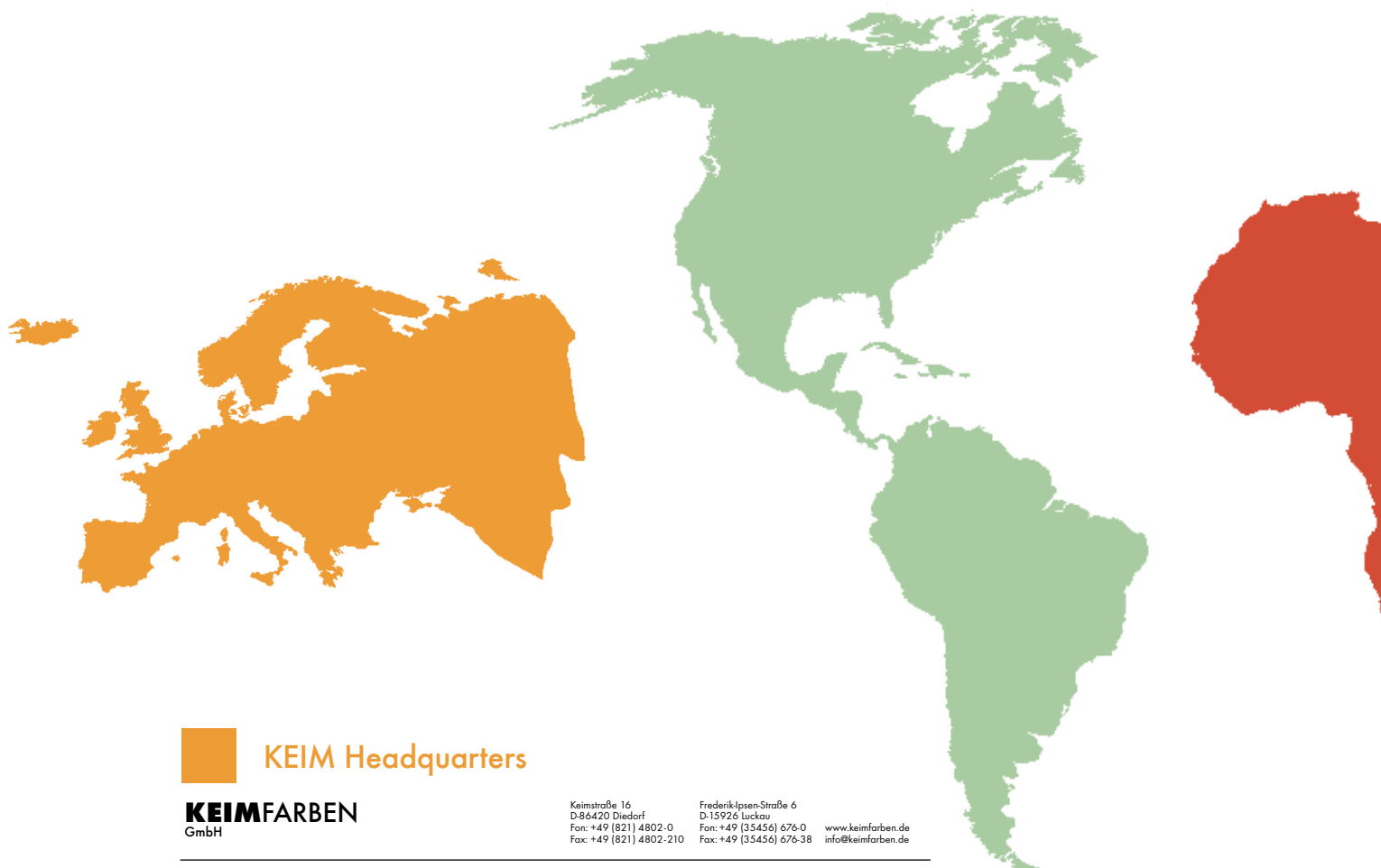
3 Sydney Opera House (Australia)

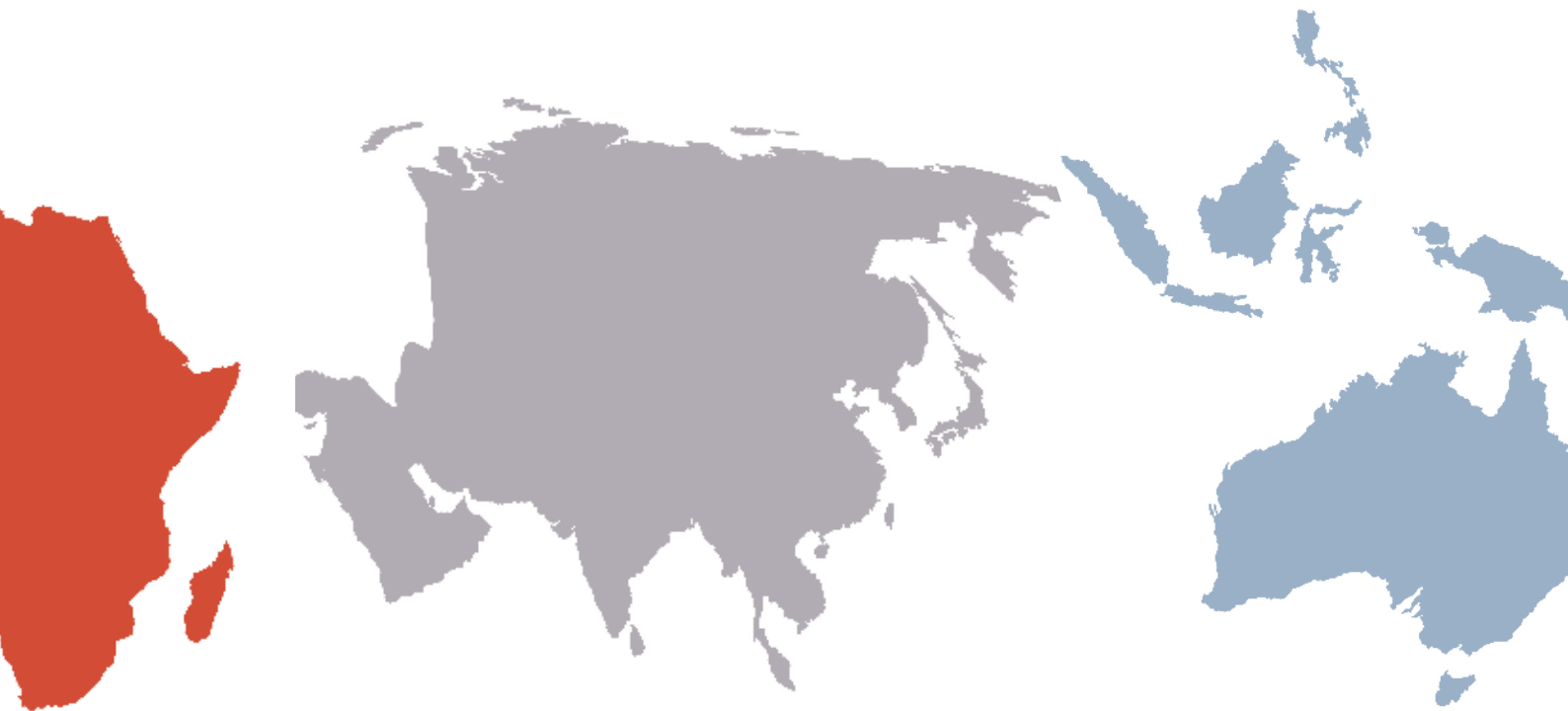
